

# A NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

#### WHAT WILL OUR LEGACY BE?

THE CHILDREN was supposed to open onstage at Live Arts two years ago. Brochures were printed, the casting was done, the design team had been working with the director for some time, and initial set drawings were complete. Then March 2020 happened. A few weeks delay turned rapidly into months and then years.

When I was looking at this 2021/22 Season, I spoke with the directors of the shows that had been so cruelly curtailed. With a little arm-twisting, Betsy agreed to revisit the show. I'm glad she was convinced. During much of those two years, I was in Northern California, witnessing heartbreaking wildfires, unbreathable smokechoked air, and no rain. Glaciers continued to melt, extreme weather became a norm.

This is a show that's hard to write about without spoilers. I can say that it's set in the not-too-distant future, or maybe it's an alternate reality in our own times. The story and the setting are certainly recognizable and the events taking place believable. Lucy Kirkwood is telling us a story of three people's intertwined lives, while covering immense important territory: where do our moral responsibilities lie—as individuals, as members of society—for our future planet-dwellers? What will our legacy be?

As much as "thought-provoking" may be an overused descriptor in theater blurbs, THE CHILDREN is just that, and more.

# A NOTE FROM **THE DIRECTOR**

We began rehearsals for this play in March 2020.

Pandemic.

With a (mostly) new cast and crew and all new designers, we began rehearsing for this wave of production in February 2022.

It is unnerving to be working on a play that has become more relevant to our challenges and our anxieties with every passing catastrophe.

I don't want to give the plot away, but I will say that it was inspired by a true story.

And, as relevant as this story may be to our time, the play is very much a play about relationships. A program note dare not attempt to reduce it to the circumstances of its plot or to the ideas or issues it throws at us. And, please, enjoy its wit.

I saw the original production of this play in London. I made a special stop to see its closing weekend at the Royal Court in January 2017. That production moved on to Broadway, and since then the play has enjoyed productions in major regional theaters. It is the only play I've wanted to direct for five years.

Sincere thanks to all who have made this possible, to those who ventured forth with me in 2020, and to those who stuck with us or came on board this season—for many of you it has meant doing double time with other commitments. Special thanks to Rain.

From the beginning of this re-boot I've received an education on how challenging it is/has been to re-boot theater these days.
