The Power of New Works

Responsive to our newly revised strategic plan, reading committees looked for expansive "artistic distinction" and were encouraged to nominate finalists representing a dynamic cross-section of submissions. **Wonders ensued!**

Representative Leadership

At this woman-led organization, a woman-led program prioritized women-led artistic teams and now more than half our programming is directed by women and non-binary folk.

Programming Celebrations

Over 70% of selected works come from writers who selfidentify as "historically marginalized" artists. This single data point thrills me!

Community Enthusiasm

Fifty performers, 20 directors, over 100 volunteers + a dozen community partners comprise our volunteer teams. This festival represents more than playwright interest—the community is ready!

The **Spotlight Series** features Gibson Theater productions of developed scripts. The collection of works featured represents our community's intimate connections to concepts of legacy and monumentality. The plays explore grief, reconciliation, delight, labor, and the enduring beauty of the noble human project: building a just, loving world.

New Works are Live Arts-produced readings. These plays were selected from 62 finalists and represent a spectrum of playwright experience. We are thrilled that more that 60% are nationally recognized scripts helmed by local directors. Each production is 100% volunteer-powered.

Co-productions showcase local playwrights, performers, and organizations to bring additional offerings to our stages with selections presented by our partners: The Live Arts Playwrights' Lab. Charlottesville Playwrights Collective, and LingXi Chinese Theater.

Explore, converse, and connect

New Reads are a collection of conceptual works performed on/offsite — theatrical in nature, but not necessarily "plays." They expand our thinking about what performance means and can do. These "reads" will inspire dialogues about the power of story and the caliber of local performers.

Community Intensives are one or twoday educational opportunities for actors who would like to deepen their understanding of creating, developing, and engaging with new work, guided by teaching artists Priyanka Shetty, Daniel Kunkel, Chris Jeter, Andrew Bryce, Ronda Hewitt, and David Minton. Live Arts volunteers get 15% off registration!

Parties and passes provide opportunities for folks to commune and soak in the full festival experience. Join us for opening and closing parties, weekly Artist Hours at Common House, our neighborhood partner. From the Director of New Works

It's been a winding road, but we are finding our way to a joyful destination: the inaugural **WATERWORKS FESTIVAL** is here! I'm beyond thrilled (and a little anxious) to share more with you about this tremendous undertaking. As our beloved subscribing audience, I want to ensure you have the low-down on all the happenings. So, let's look back at how we got here: it all began with a plan to celebrate local playwrights + new works through one single offer.

In the fall, we put out a call for new works submissions of unpublished, unproduced scripts and received **over 500 submissions** from playwrights both local and beyond. This phenomenal interest confirmed our hypothesis: playwrights are hungry for opportunities to see and share their work!

With our readers furiously at work, we turned our attention to curating the program and engaging volunteers — over 100 folks are lifting this endeavor!

Making theater is symbiotic. Performances depend on audiences and desire for our engagement. When we laugh, rebel, embrace, or ignore, storytellers notice, and the work transforms. That's why, in this inaugural festival, we are committed to presenting a spectrum of stories — this festival is a tapestry of perspective and richness can be found in the dialogues *between* works. We're bringing varied, diverse, and unique readings. All you need to bring is enthusiasm about the power of theatrical storytelling and genuine interest in taking a risk.




