*Charlottesville, VA*—Live Arts announces a full season of powerhouse shows for its 2022/23 Transformations Season. The season opens with Caryl Churchill's kaleidoscopic LOVE AND INFORMATION, and continues with the heartfelt musical **VIOLET** with music by Jeanine Tesori and lyrics and book by Brian Crawley. The musical is followed by Jez Butterworth's mysterious **THE RIVER**, then **CRUMBS** 

**FROM THE TABLE OF JOY** follows in the spring, a poignant memory play by Lynn Nottage. Next arrives the outrageously funny solo show **BUYER & CELLAR**. The Transformations Season closes with the first ever **WaterWorks Festival**, a month-long festival celebrating new writing for the theater. Subscription packages start at just \$90 for the season. "Live Arts audiences are risk-takers. They recognize theater has the power to change, to transform lives," says Artistic Director Susan E. Evans. "Every theater-maker who joins us to pick up a hammer, hang a light, sew a costume, act, direct, design, or produce is shaping a one-of-a-kind lightbulb moment together."

"The shows that make up the 2022/23 Season are all about transformations. Whether the story explores human connections and information overload, a journey to erase a disfiguring scar, a couple on a moonless night, a family in transition, or a lonely superstar and her fan, each one is a powerful story of change," says Evans.

Live Arts is especially excited to launch the WaterWorks Festival as the grand finale of the Transformations Season—a month-long celebration dedicated to the playwright in all of us. WaterWorks showcases local voices through readings of new plays and musicals, workshops for writers and directors, contests, and more.

# **SEASON 2022/23: TRANSFORMATIONS**

Caryl Churchill's **LOVE AND INFORMATION** asks us how we can connect with each other and make sense of it all amidst the glut of data and noise in our everyday lives. Fifty-seven self-contained playlets and more than 100 characters leave us abuzz with questions as we puzzle over the moments before and after.

A soaring musical pilgrimage by the composer of *Fun Home* and *Caroline, or Change,* **VIOLET** arrives on the Live Arts stage in November. With a mixture of country, gospel, blues, and honky-tonk rock, this heart-felt piece with music by Jeanine Tesori and lyrics and book by Brian Crawley was a Drama Critics' Circle Award Winner and Tony nominee for best revival of a musical. In 1964, a young woman from a North Carolina hilltop town in the Blue Ridge Mountains takes a 900-mile Greyhound bus journey. She hopes a televangelist preacher in Tulsa will pray away the deep scar on her face and transform her life. Based on the short story *The Ugliest Pilgrim* by Doris Betts. *Presented by Latitude 38. From the writer of the internationally acclaimed plays *Jerusalem* and *The Ferryman*, Live Arts brings the Virginia premiere of Jez Butterworth's **THE RIVER** to Charlottesville in January 2023. It's a moonless night in August when the sea trout are ready to run. A man brings a woman to a remote cabin on the cliff, above the river, where he has come to fish since he was a boy. And then suddenly she is missing. Haunting, lyrical, and mysteriously thrilling, **THE RIVER** will keep audiences teetering on the edge, a question hanging in the air: when we find someone new, are we summoning someone once lost?

A warm and touching coming-of-age story told through the eyes of 17-year-old Ernestine Crump, CRUMBS FROM THE TABLE OF JOY is next up in the Gibson Theater. Playwright Lynn Nottage's memory play is set in 1950 Brooklyn, where recently widowed Godfrey Crump has just moved his family north from Pensacola. The Crump girls escape their isolation by going to the cinema, while their father finds solace in radio evangelist Father Divine. Things change quickly when Aunt Lily, a free-spirited communist, bursts into their home.

Playwright Tolins got the idea for BUYER & CELLAR, a delightfully hilarious solo show about the price of fame and the value of "things," from Barbra Streisand's coffee-table book, "My Passion for Design," which showed off her subterranean emporium.
