

#### A NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

My sister asked me what this play was about, and I had to respond, without any snarkiness, that the title says it all. Just note which word comes first.

Caryl Churchill has fractured a typical play into 50+ pieces, and each shard of a piece becomes an entire story, even those that are only five lines long. She leaves the setting up to you. She leaves the division of voices speaking, the roles or characters, up to you. She leaves the order of scenes within sections up to you. She even gives you random snippets of life to insert, or not – a sneeze, a recitation of multiplication tables, or an indecipherable genetic code.

The whole exercise is like assembling a jigsaw puzzle of stories, an array of people, sharing intimate moments of love ... and information.

For me, this play has meant relinquishing and relaxing the reins, and letting my amazingly inventive actors discover who they are, and where they are, and, in a few cases, when they are. Well into the rehearsal process we were changing fundamental elements of character and location. Collectively, we let the stories find themselves, much like watching a sculpture emerge from a block of marble, and hopefully being faithful to the playwright's words. What is perhaps most astonishing, the play coheres.

What a privilege to work on this play with so many creative souls, each adding their own love—and information—into the mix.





#### **PLAYWRIGHT & DIRECTOR BIOS**



### CARYL CHURCHILL PLAYWRIGHT

Caryl Churchill is a British playwright celebrated for works such as *Cloud 9* (1979), *Top Girls* (1982), *Serious Money* (1987), *Blue Heart* (1997), *Far Away* (2000), and *A Number* (2002). She has been described as "one of Britain's greatest poets and innovators for the contemporary stage" and her extensive list of works (including plays, television, radio dramas, and more) has garnered awards

and honors spanning almost five decades. Her work is known for dramatizing abuses of power, using non-naturalistic techniques, and exploring sexual politics and feminist themes.



#### SUSAN E. EVANS DIRECTOR

Susan (she/her) joined the talented Live Arts team in June 2021. Prior to moving to Charlottesville, she held several artistic director positions in the San Francisco Bay Area, including Eastenders Repertory Company, the Douglas Morrisson Theatre, and Town Hall Theatre. In the Bay Area, she also directed at Contra Costa Civic Theatre and with Actors Reading Writers, and has ongoing collaborations with solo

artist Carolyn Doyle and playwright Scott Munson (The Brecht Project). She is a proud graduate of the Drama Studio London @ Berkeley and an associate member of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society. www.susaneevansdirector.com


