

A NOTE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Come along for the journey.

Isn't it tantalizing to see a map in the frontispiece of a book? I love journey stories in books and on stage where we travel alongside a cast of characters. In VIOLET, we enjoy both the real and metaphorical: a Greyhound bus trip, and a quest for self-discovery. As only a piece of theater can do, a bus emerges from chairs, a diner from a table and counter, a rooming house from a bed and doorway. With our imaginations sparked, we fill in all the pieces and await the road ahead with eagerness, excitement, and a bit of trepidation.

There's a delicacy about Violet's story, and about these people she encounters, and a kind of gentleness one doesn't expect from a musical with anthems like "On My Way." It's a reminder that great musicals can be about inner soul-searching, as much as megaproduction numbers. We are encouraged to embrace the recognizable humanity of the story with songs that pierce the heart.

My thanks go out to this fantastic, hard-working, versatile, talented team of artists. At my last company, we had a production of VIOLET in the works, sadly cut short by the pandemic. This Live Arts show feels like a special gift, a shining example of the perseverance and resilience of theater and the people who make it.



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COMPOSER, LYRICIST, & DIRECTOR BIOS



JEANINE TESORI | Composer

Jeanine Tesori has written music for Broadway, opera, film, and television. She is one of the first female composers commissioned by the Metropolitan Opera, and ASCAP cites her as the first female composer to have two new musicals running concurrently on Broadway. Her musicals include *Fun Home* (Tony Award for best original score, Pulitzer finalist); *Soft Power* (Pulitzer finalist); *Caroline*, *or Change* (Olivier

Award for Best New Musical; lyrics, Tony Kushner); *Violet* (four Tony nominations including Best Musical Revival); *Shrek* (lyrics, David Lindsay-Abaire); *Thoroughly Modern Millie*; and *Twelfth Night*. Most recently, she composed the music for *Kimberly Akimbo*, with book and lyrics by David Lindsay-Abaire, which opened on Broadway October 12, 2022.



BRIAN CRAWLEY | Lyricist/Book Writer

Brian Crawley is an award-winning American playwright and screenwriter. His work includes the book and lyrics for *A Little Princess* (composer Andrew Lippa); *Violet* (composer Jeanine Tesori); *Evangeline* (Ted Dykstra); and *Down There* (composer Lewis Flinn). His awards include the Kleban Award, Richard Rodgers Musical Production Award, AT&T OnStage Award, Lucille Lortel Award for Outstanding


Musical, and New York Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Musical.



PERRY MEDLIN | Director/Choreographer

Perry's choreography and directing work with Live Arts includes THE LEGEND OF GEORGIA MCBRIDE, FOLLIES, PIPPIN, 13, and GYPSY, as well as many summers working with the teen theater program. Other local credits include *Young Frankenstein* and *The Laramie Project* with Four County Players. Perry (he/they) holds a BFA in musical theater from Elon University and teaches theater and public speaking at

Tandem Friends School, where they have directed productions of *Picasso* at the Lapin Agile, Little Women, 26 Pebbles, and The Complete Works of William Shakespeare, Abridged, among others.

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
