

A NOTE FROM THE **ARTIST DIRECTOR**

When we announced that HEATHERS was going to be our teen musical this year, emails started pouring in for auditions.

When we wrote the audition notice, we knew of the need to let people know that HEATHERS deals with some heavy issues, including suicide, bullying, gun violence, and homophobia, among others! HEATHERS is a dark comedy. We wanted to communicate that its purpose in including such dark content was to expose and confront the darkness head-on using satire—to poke at these topics considered too serious, too painful, in a comedic way. And perhaps then to provoke thoughtful discussions.

On July 4, the *New York Times* published (yet another) article with the title "It's Hard to Stage a School Play Without Political Drama." It said that school plays are now "the latest battleground" in a politically and culturally divided America. High school teachers are finding their choices of plays scrutinized, censored, and rejected. And those teachers are now self-censoring. One Oregon teacher had combatted objections, but ultimately produced, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*, which includes gay fathers. But when her students said they wanted to do HEATHERS the following year, she felt she had to tell them "no."

Thank you to Ti, Daniel, Abby, Mandy, Anne, Hannah, all the other creative team members, and to this astonishingly talented cast. I am proud of the show, and of Live Arts.

KEVIN MURPHY | Co-Writer

Kevin Murphy was a producer of the original LA and NY productions of HEATHERS (Drama Desk nomination for music). He also provided lyrics and cowrote the book for the award-winning stage musical *Reefer Madness* and was a producer on both the original Los Angeles and Off-Broadway productions, and co-adapter of *Reefer* into a Showtime Original

movie. Other TV credits include Desperate Housewives, Defiance, Ed, Reaper, Caprica and Hellcats.



LAURENCE O'KEEFE | Co-Writer

Laurence O'Keefe was a producer of the original LA and NY productions of HEATHERS. With his wife Nell Benjamin, he won the Olivier Award for co-writing Legally Blonde: The Musical, which ran two and a half years on the West End and has toured the UK. 
LIZ STONE | Costume Co-Designer/Dresser

Kids experience hard things. Kids talk about hard things.

Being a kid, in and of itself in contemporary society, is one of the hardest things to be right now. 


