



at CHUANG Stage. Brandon is currently an MFA playwright at Boston University, and he holds a double BA from the University of





Her poetry has appeared in various anthologies and journals including: Loch Raven Review, Jimson Weed, and Whisky Advocate. She is the poet and author of "Love Always," "Hobby and Jessie," "Two Little Girls in a Wading Pool," "A Cruise in Rare Waters," "Sometimes the Little Town,"

and was a finalist for the Poetry Society of Virginia's 2017 Book Award. "Needville," her book of poetry about effects of coal mining on southwest Virginia, was released in 2019. Her other books include "Simple River" (Cyberwit, 2020) and "Poetry Matters: Essays on the Art and Craft of Writing Poetry" (2022). Her play, NEEDVILLE, was revived in January 2024 at Live Arts before being presented as a Spotlight production in Live Arts' 2024 WATERWORKS festival.



SYNOPSIS: In this autobiographical hometown musical, a snowstorm rages as three generations are forced to confront their turbulent relationships and generational trauma in the very city where their ancestors were enslaved.


