

A NOTE FROM THE **ARTISTIC DIRECTOR**

Welcome to THE LIGHTNING THIEF: THE PERCY JACKSON MUSICAL, our summer teen show!

I have a confession to make. I haven't read Rick Riordan's wildly popular novels (or seen the film or the new series). I believe the books were just coming out mid-way through the *Harry Potter* craze, and I made my way through five of those six books. But my nieces and nephews (age ranging from 16 to 28) are huge Percy Jackson fans, and after reading this script and watching these amazing talented young artists performing, I am all on board.

The adventures are thrilling, the characters quirky and real, and it certainly doesn't hurt to throw in all that epic Greek mythology with a few fabulous monsters. The biggest takeaway from my neophyte perspective is the story of friendships and making your own family. Percy and his comrades' life struggles are supremely relatable, whether you're 16 or 60. I love the way these demi-gods learn to navigate their circumstances, confront their enemies, survive trials, and emerge better humans in the end, ready to face the challenges together.

As Percy's mother tells him, "The things that make you different are the very things that make you strong." Wise advice. Thank you for joining us on Percy's truly remarkable quest.

A NOTE FROM THE **DIRECTOR**

As a child I read *The Lightning Thief* by Rick Riordan and remembered loving how similar but also different it was to *Harry Potter, Lord of the Rings*, and all my other favorite fantasy novels that I would read instead of doing homework. As an adult revisiting this story, I still loved the adventure, but I found myself struck by how quietly sad this story is. My heart broke for these young characters who were begging for some sign of affection from a parent who was entirely too busy to deal with or even notice them.

In our discussions as a cast and a design team, the themes of family, rejection, and acceptance began to emerge more and more. This is a show full of monsters, adventure, cool swords, and ridiculously difficult musical numbers. It is also a story of young people seeking their place and finding the validation for their existence within themselves and from their peers.

I hope you enjoy this show and the immense work these comically talented young people have put into making this world come alive.

MEET THE CREATORS



JOE TRACZ | Playwright

Joe Tracz is a writer whose work has been seen on Broadway in *Be More Chill* (with Joe Iconis) and *The Lightning Thief: The Percy Jackson Musical* (with Rob Rokicki; Drama Desk nominee for Outstanding Book). Other credits include the musical *Poster Boy* (with Craig Carnelia, Williamstown Theatre Festival). TV credits include Netflix's *Lemony Snicket*'s *A Series of Unfortunate Events* (Peabody Award recipient; Emmy,

Humanitas Prize, and WGA Award nominee) and *Dash & Lily*, which premiered on Netflix in 2020. Joe is an alumnus of the Ars Nova Play Group and a former Playwrights Realm writing fellow. He earned his BA from Kalamazoo College in Michigan and his MFA from NYU's Tisch School of the Arts.



ROB ROKICKI | Music & Lyrics

Rob Rokicki is a composer and lyricist whose work has been recognized worldwide and nominated for Drama Desk, Lortel and Off-Broadway Alliance awards. Rokicki is best known for his music and lyrics in the critically acclaimed Broadway show *The Lightning Thief: The Percy Jackson Musical* for Theatreworks USA. Other credits include: *Punk Rock Girl!*. a

musical he orchestrated and co-arranged with collaborator and friend Joe Iconis; the graphic novel musical *Monstersongs*; his immersive musical about escaping a cult, *Experience Marianas*; *Uni the Unicorn*, commissioned by Bay Area Children's Theater; and many others. Rokicki's work, which "lives at the perfect intersection of musical theater and radio rock," is regularly featured in cabarets and concerts throughout the world. He is a two-time Larson Award finalist, alum of the BMI writing workshop, and member of the Dramatists Guild.

SOPHIA SAUNIER | Assistant Stage Manager


