Founded in 1990, Live Arts is a national model for engaged community theater. For the last three decades, we have dedicated ourselves to the mission of "forging theater and community" in Charlottesville. Our engagement in the community runs deep, and the quality of our volunteer-staged productions is high.

We are the anchor tenant in a four-story performance space in the heart of downtown Charlottesville and attract participants, students, and audiences from across Central Virginia.

In a typical year, we present a compelling season of mainstage plays and musicals produced by more than 900 volunteers. We launch a month-long new works festival each May that celebrates untold stories by emerging playwrights. We also run a year-round lab that helps local playwrights develop their work.
