If you are comfortable with one of the dialects in the play, please let the director know; she may ask you to demonstrate by reading a side.

Character List:

Please note: descriptions are the playwrights'

Our Characters are these women:

MARY – Creole or Black, accent varies: Jamaican-American with touches of patwah. She is many things, but at her core, she keeps finding herself to be a legend, a businesswoman, a fierce and charming striver.

MAY – White, accent varies: American, English. She is many things, but at her core, she keeps finding herself to be an exacting technician, a businesswoman, a woman mother who needs everyone to be better.

MIRIAM - White, accent varies: American, English, Scottish

MERRY – White, accent varies: American, English, Scottish

MAMIE (pronounced May-mee not Mam-mee) – black, accent varies: Jamaican-American with touches of patwah.

DUPPY MARY – Black, accent varies: Jamaican-American with touches of patwah.
