**GENERAL NOTE:** These two shows are performed in a rotating repertory, meaning they alternate on a given night. You will be given an opportunity to let the directors know which show or shows you are interested in. We encourage actors to audition for both shows, if interested. In an ideal world, the directors are seeking one cast for both shows, however actors only interested in one or the other will still be considered!

Actors must be 14-21 years old to be considered for casting.

**Show Description:** Grandson of the infamous Victor Frankenstein, Frederick Frankenstein (pronounced "Fronk-en-steen") inherits his family's estate in Transylvania. With the help of a hunchbacked sidekick, Igor (pronounced "Eye-gore"), and a leggy lab assistant, Inga (pronounced normally), Frederick finds himself in the mad scientist shoes of his ancestors. "It's alive!" he exclaims as he brings to life a creature to rival his grandfather's. Eventually, of course, the monster escapes and hilarity continuously abounds.

*We encourage color-conscious casting and are striving to be an inclusive theater. The idea behind conscious casting is that the casting decisions are made with intent. Productions actively seek to create a more diverse cast while respecting the playwright's specific character descriptions.*

- Inga - Frederick's young assistant. Attractive and a resident of Transylvania.
- Elizabeth Benning - Frederick's boisterous fiancé.
- Frau Blücher - Stern housekeeper of the Frankenstein estate and former lover of Victor Frankenstein.
- Inspector Hans Kemp - The head of police in Transylvania. Driven by justice, with a wooden arm and leg.
